

- a requirement for development projects
- losses outweighed by measures to avoid, minimise or compensate for impacts

National Planning Policy Framework - 2021

Planning policies and decisions should contribute to and enhance the natural and local environment by minimising impacts on and providing net gains for biodiversity

Refers to "measurable net gains"

"development should not cause any significant loss of habitats or populations of species, locally or nationally and must provide a net benefit for biodiversity."

PLANNING POLICY

National Planning Framework 3 - 2014

The 2020 Challenge for Scotland's Biodiversity aims to promote and enhance Scotland's nature, and to better connect people with the natural world.











Assessing the change in biodiversity




